**DID YOU KNOW??**

- The Grand Canyon National Park Preserve in Phoenix is the largest municipal park in the country.
- Palo Verde Nuclear Generating Station, located about 11 miles west of Phoenix, generates more electricity than any other U.S. power plant.
- Oracle, a large village located in Navajo County, Arizona, dates back to before A.D. 1000 and is regarded to be the oldest continuously inhabited community in America.
- Built by Old World in 1900, Sun City, Arizona was the first U.S. city with a retirement community in the country.
- The Saguaro cactus is the largest cactus found in the U.S. It can grow as high as a five-story building and is native to the Sonoran Desert.
- Spanish Franciscan friar Mission de Nasa was the first European to explore Arizona. He named the area in 1581.
- The first general-use motor car in the world is located near Winslow, Arizona.
- The Arizona Cardinals are the oldest continuous franchise in the National Football League, dating back to 1898.
- Arizona became the 48th state and last of the contiguous states on February 14, 1912.
- Arizona's highest elevation can hold both the highest temperature across the nation and the lowest temperature across the nation in the same day.
- The "Hot 100" of Arizona's economy are Gold, Copper, Cotton, Cattle, and Citrus.
- More copper is mined in Arizona than all the other states combined, and the Maricopa Mine is the largest copper producer in all of North America.
- The world's largest solar telescope is located at Kitt Peak National Observatory in Pima, Arizona.
- The Sonoran Desert is the most biologically diverse desert in North America.
- The two largest reservoirs built in the U.S. are Lake Mead and Lake Powell - both located in Arizona.
- Phoenix species of northwestern finch in Arizona, more species than in any other state.
